SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS IN MAGNET PROGRAMS

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SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS IN MAGNET PROGRAMS

Having an IEP does not automatically preclude a child from participating in a Magnet Program. Please be aware of the following information regarding Special Education Students in or applying to Magnet Programs:

I. Magnet Students Enrolled In Magnet Programs

- Elementary
 - To be eligible for a Magnet, a student's IEP must not require full-day placement in a Special Day Program (SDP).
 - RSP students are eligible for an elementary Magnet program.
- Secondary
 - To be eligible for a Magnet, the student's IEP must not require placement in more than 50% of the school day in a Special Day Program (SDP).
 - To be considered a Magnet student, the student must be enrolled in a minimum of three (3) Magnet classes.

If there is a Special Education student enrolled in your Magnet who does not currently meet the above requirements, please contact Gloria Ginger Cole, Coordinator, Integration Compliance, immediately.

II. Magnet Students on Magnet Rosters

- Active List Rosters (Newly Selected, B Status)
 - Students with a special education designation listed on the Active List are, based on their IEP, eligible to participate in your Magnet program. In other words, there can be an offer of Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) for the Magnet program written in the student's IEP. The IEPs of these students have been reviewed by the Special Education Support Unit staff.
 - Parents have received a provisional acceptance letter stating that student is eligible to attend the Magnet provided the IEP is rewritten by the sending school. In

the letter, parents are referred to their Local District Support Unit for assistance in getting the IEP rewritten.

- Should the student's needs change before enrollment to the school, acceptance to the Magnet program may not be possible. The Magnet Coordinator should then work with the Local District Support Unit to communicate this to the student's parent.
- Wait and Late List Rosters (W and Z Status)
 - The IEPs of students with a special education designation listed on the Wait List have not yet been "reviewed" by the Support Unit Staff. Therefore, it is unknown as to whether the specific student's IEP needs can be met at the Magnet Program.
 - **PRIOR TO CONTACTING THE PARENT** of the Special Education student, you must first contact the Special Education Support Unit and ask them to determine if the student's specific IEP needs can be met at your Magnet.
 - If the Support Unit "approves" the student, you may continue with the process of contacting the student from your Wait List.
 - If the Support Unit states that the student's needs cannot be met at your Magnet, please contact Sara Lasnover, Magnet Program Specialist to inform her of this decision so the parents can be appropriately contacted.
